As the athletics captain of Rhenish, the 4M athletics competition of 2025 was an unforgettable experience, despite the scorching heat that challenged us all. 

Juliet Venables delivered an outstanding performance at the SANESA (South African National Equestrian Schools Association) Qualifier 1 Competition, held recently at Europa Equestrian near Atlantis.

Representing Rhenish Girls' High School, she rode with determination and skill, achieving fantastic results. Competing on her horse, Miranda, Juliet took first place in Dressage and first place in the 90cm Show Jumping. She also placed second in the 90cm Equitation and second in the Working Hunter (90cm-1m). To top it all off, she secured third place in an additional Dressage class.

What makes her achievements even more impressive is that she was the only Grade 8 rider competing against older high school learners. This is her first year as part of the SANESA Winelands Team, after previously riding for the Cape Metro Team for four years.

Juliet proudly wore the Rhenish logo on her numnah, making the school's presence known in the equestrian arena. The Equestrian Society is currently working on finalising standard shirts, numnahs, and ear veils to create a more uniform look for all Rhenish SANESA riders.
