The Rhenish swimming contingent made a splash at both the South African Junior Nationals (SANJ) and the South African Open Water Swimming Championships, showcasing their talent and determination in the water.

Incredible swims from our own Grace Morris at SANJ, where she had no problem making her mark in the South African swimming world and achieved the following results:

1st Place for U16 200m backstroke
2nd Place for U16 100m backstroke
2nd Place for U16 50m backstroke
2nd Place for U16 100m freestyle
2nd Place for U16 50m freestyle
2nd Place for U19 mixed freestyle Relay
3rd Place for U19 100m medley Relay

Maya Laubscher demonstrated her prowess by clinching third place in the 4x 1500m relay at the Open Water Nationals. Her exceptional performance also earned her a berth in various events at SANJ, highlighting her versatility and skill in the pool.

Danielle Cronje proved her mettle by qualifying for an impressive six events at SANJ. Her dedication paid off with a third place in the 4x 50m freestyle relay, showcasing her speed and teamwork. Additionally, Cronje's stellar performance earned her a qualification for the SA Senior Nationals, although circumstances prevented her from competing.

Ava-Loren van Galen showcased her talent by securing spots in multiple events at SANJ. Her determination led to a commendable fourth-place finish in her age group for the 50m freestyle, demonstrating her speed and competitive spirit.

Amy Hartung's dedication to the sport was evident as she qualified for various events at SANJ. Her standout performance at the SA Open Water Championships saw her secure third place in the 3km U14 age group race, displaying her endurance and determination in open water swimming.

Tayler Morton's achievements were highlighted by her qualification for five events at SANJ. Morton's strong showing culminated in an impressive eighth-place finish in the U16 200m backstroke, illustrating her skill and potential in competitive swimming.

Despite not having her best gala, Grace de Jongh showed up with determination and gave her all in every race. She even found herself qualifying for a spot in the 50m backstroke B-final. Her leadership as the school's swimming captain was evident, inspiring her teammates and everyone watching.

Grace Morris had some incredible races, showcasing her versatility and talent. Her results included:

- 50m backstroke: 3rd in B-final
- 200m backstroke: 4th A-final
- 4x50m freestyle relay A-team: 2nd (silver)
- 100m backstroke: 3rd in B-final
- 4x100m freestyle relay: 2nd A-team (silver)
- 50m freestyle: 4th in B-final
- 4x100m medley relay B-team: 6th place

Together, they represented Rhenish Girls' High School with pride and determination, leaving a lasting impression on the competition.

Their efforts at the 2024 South African Senior National Swimming Competition brought recognition not only to themselves but also to Rhenish Girls' High School.
