

However, the hard work was far from over, as we were not content with finishing in 8th place. Later that day, we faced the St Anne's junior team and beat them 6-3. This was another step in the right direction, and on our final day, we played St Stithians, a highly respected team, but unfortunately lost, placing us 6th overall out of 20 teams. This was just two places behind our rivals, Herschel, and an outstanding achievement for our first time attending the tournament.

It was a fantastic opportunity for our girls to play against such strong teams and an overall enjoyable experience.
