Despite the lengthy bus journey, the exceptional performances and camaraderie made the trip worthwhile. This event served as a valuable test of our athletic prowess, preparing us for upcoming competitions such as Curro Top 14 and 4M.

We departed from the school shortly after 11:00 on Friday, embarking on a five-hour journey to the Langenhoven Gimnasium hostel, our temporary home for the weekend. Upon arrival, we engaged in warm-up exercises to alleviate any travelinduced stiffness, followed by a refreshing swim and a much-needed massage. We quickly discovered that Langenhoven Gimnasium offered delectable cuisine! 
